As you can see, we have a great deal going one in October that hopefully offers a little something for everyone.

Town Ordinance Section 62-37 requires that owners of any motor vehicle principally stored, garaged or parked in the Town obtain a license decal from the Town. **The 2019 decal must be displayed on your vehicle by November 15, 2018.**

Forms and payments can be mailed back to Town Hall or dropped off in person. Town Hall will be open late on **Wednesday**, **November 7**, **until 7 p.m.** for your convenience.
